The patron saint of Burton upon Trent, St. Modwen was a 7th century nun who founded the Burton upon Trent abbey where it is said that beer was brewed and she produced miracles with the Burton well water. A crisp and refreshing blonde beer, not too bitter with a subtle malted wheat biscuit taste.

A red ale with hazelnut and coffee flavours from the malt, balanced by spicy floral hop aromas. Well-balanced with a slight bitterness. Goes well with...The full flavour of Red Ale makes a hearty companion to a Chilli Con Carne.

Charrington was a London Brewery, founded in the early 18th century. The main Charrington brewery was finally closed in 1975 although IPA continued to be brewed in various breweries. Charrington I.P.A. was very successful across London, selling nearly 1m barrels p.a. in the 1950's A malty aroma with resinous English hop notes.

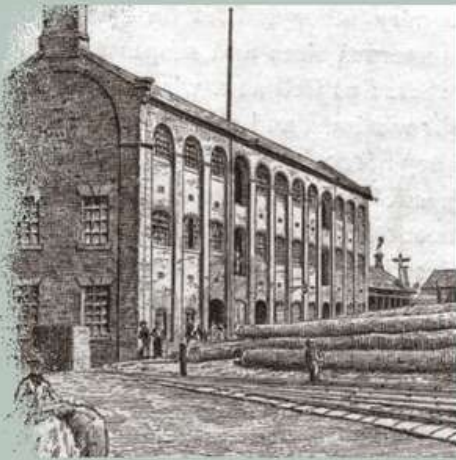

Burton upon Trent owes its brewing pedigree to its naturally hard well water (high in sulphates) which accentuates hop bitterness in beer, crucial for brewing pale ales, which Burton upon Trent is so famous for. **It is this well water that The Heritage Brewing Company use today.** Commercially brewing really took off in the early 18th century with the improved navigability of the Trent allowing beer to be shipped to Hull and onwards to the Baltic as well as south to London. By the late 19th century, $\frac{1}{4}$ of all beer sold in Britain was brewed in Burton upon Trent. During the intervening years there have been many ups and downs and many brands have come and gone. Heritage Brewing Company has been established to bring that brewing history back to life in Burton upon Trent.
